Port Bermuda - GC31631



Kings Wharf is the original berth (or the dock), Heritage Wharf is a latter addition and located next to Kings

Dockyard played roles in many historic events, including the War of 1812 and WW II. In its heyday, the Dockyard supported a thriving naval and civilian community.

The National Maritime Museum



Located in the Royal Naval Dockyard This National Museum is custodian of local maritime artifacts, heritage and history. OPEN: 9.30 am - 5pm (Last entry 4pm)

Fort Scaur – GC1F947



Fort Scaur is located at the western end of Bermuda in Somerset and on the highest hill top. This fort was built in 1870s at the time when the relationship between British and the Americans were strained. Ironically, although British soldiers were posted at the Fort Scaur during the World War-I, during the World War-II American soldiers were stationed here. After all Britain and U.S finally became allies during the world wars.

West Whale Bay Beach Park & Park – GC1TC0E



This 360 pick is A LIBA's favorite View especially during low tide. Whale Bay Fort and the Battery was used to protect the entrance to *Hogfish Cut*, a narrow channel that could potentially be used by the enemy to get into the land area and attack the Royal Naval Dockyard. The semi-circular fort is on a spectacular setting. It overlooks the [West Whale Bay Beach](#) and you get a sweeping view of the south coast from here

Gibbs Hill Lighthouse – GCH3FK



This cast iron built lighthouse is the oldest working lighthouse in the western hemisphere. The lighthouse has 185 steps to the top in eight flights and it is the oldest working cast iron lighthouse in the Americas.

Horseshoe Bay Beach –GC316MN



Horseshoe Bay Beach in Southampton Bermuda clearly stands out from the rest. It's really special! With a curved stretch of sand against the backdrop of blue waters of the Atlantic, this beautiful pink sandy beach forms the shape of a horseshoe.

Jobson’s Cove – GC2G1FH



This picture-perfect beach with its pink sands, gentle waves and calm waters gives the feel of a serene hideaway. It's also an ideal place to relax and picnic. The enormous rocks are made of limestone and hardened volcanic lava

Warwick Long Bay – GC2WFP2



It is a long and magnificent half a mile stretch of pink sand beach. This unique color is created by the force of the ocean's waves that crush sea invertebrates like coral, clams, mollusks, etc. The pulverized shells mix with the white sand giving it a pretty pink tint. It's one of the most picturesque beaches of Bermuda. Warwick Long Bay lies on [South Shore Park](#) in Warwick parish.

Fort Hamilton – GC437TZ



Fort Hamilton is a picturesque site overlooking the lush gardens and the harbor. It was built in 1870s to protect the Hamilton Harbor and form a line of defense for the western Royal Naval Dockyard.

Anglican Cathedral – GC1TT46



The Cathedral of the Most Holy Trinity (often referred to as the Bermuda Cathedral) is an Anglican cathedral located on Church Street in Hamilton, Bermuda. The original building was designed in the Early English style by James Cranston of Oxford in 1844 and was completed in 1869. That building was destroyed by fire in 1884. Scottish architect William Hay, who had been consulted on the construction of the first building in 1848-1849 and again in 1862, was hired to design the current structure in 1885 in the Gothic Revival style. The structure was primarily built from Bermuda limestone with the exception of several decorative features made from carved Caen stone that were brought in from France. For a small fee, visitors to the cathedral can climb the tower for a view of Hamilton and its harbour.

Spanish Point Park – GC3ENJF



There is a small area of land reaching out into the mouth of Great Sound water area, called the Spanish Point. It is a picturesque park with views of the distant dockyard towards the west. It's a wonderful place for picnics or just to relax. It's about 2 miles from the City of Hamilton. Vehicles reach this area through [Black Watch Pass](#)



a cut through the high coral cliff that was opened in 1934.

Bermuda Aquarium, Museum & Zoo (BAMZ) – GC4A1YR



This little jewel can be found in Flatts, just tucked away on the North Shore. A trip to the Bermuda Aquarium, Museum and Zoo (BAMZ for short) is always a pleasant surprise. There is so much variety offered in the exhibits and species that reside here, yet BAMZ provides an intimacy you rarely get to experience in other places. You will have to pay the entry fee of \$10.00 to find the geocache hidden here. It is one of the Department of Conservations 20 cache GeoTour.

Spittal Pond – GC46YCN



Spittal Pond, located in Smiths Parish Bermuda, is the largest and the most premium nature reserve and national park of the island. It spreads over some 64-acres of land area. The reserve stretches along the south shore coastal line and at its center is the 8-acre Spittal Pond. It's a sprawling sanctuary with a valley having the one remaining salt marsh. Around 1543 the crew of a vessel...a Portuguese slaver, returning in ballast to Europe in 1543 crashed on the reefs." 'Portuguese Rock': is the memorial of a bold Portuguese claim for the island. It connects Bermuda with the long tradition of Portuguese maritime and commercial activity that built the foundations of the modern Atlantic World decades before Cristóbal Colón's arrival in the Americas.

Kings Square

Kings square is the main town center of St. George's Bermuda now a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site and is also known as the Town Square. The square was created only in 19th century by filling up a marshy part of St. George Harbor. At the waterfront there is a replica Ducking Stool which is used to reenact the colonial history by dunking a woman into the water who plays the role of a nagging wench. This was a way



of punishment used in the early days particularly for nagging and gossiping women. You will see this strange and funny demonstration overseen by the

Town Crier in his colonial costume and attended by many tourists. This show is free to all.

St Peter's Church – GC2XDAR



St. Peter's Church is the oldest Anglican Church outside of the British Isles, and the oldest Protestant church in continuous use in the New World. It is a cultural and spiritual icon in Bermuda and an integral part of our UNESCO World Heritage Site the Town of St. George. The present building dates back to 1713. A walk around the churchyard reveals two graveyards: one for whites and one for black slaves which is historically significant.
